# Red-tail Land Conservancy

#### Our Mission:

Red-tail Land Conservancy preserves, protects, and restores natural areas and farm land in east central Indiana while increasing awareness of our natural heritage.

#### About Us:

Focused on this mission in six counties in east central Indiana, the not-for-profit land trust has grown steadily since its inception in 1999 when a public meeting held at Minnetrista Cultural Center in Muncie attracted 87 people.

Funded entirely by private contributions from individuals, business, and foundations, RLC hired a full-time Executive Director and recorded its first conservation easement in July, 2000. In its first decade, Red-tail Land Conservancy has provided land conservation options to individual landowners and partnered with local governments in restoration projects while engaging students and adult volunteers in land stewardship activities and education.

As a result, over 2,600 acres of natural areas and farm land are permanently protected, and Red-tail Land Conservancy receives growing support and recognition for its role in improving east central Indiana.

#### Hotel > Oakwood Retreat Center/White River Woods

Turn left onto Fox Ridge Ln then another left 294 N. Turn left onto W McGalliard Rd. Continue on McGalliard Rd for approx. 5mi. Turn right onto 300 E/N Country Club Rd. Turn left onto IN-32 W/E Jackson St. Turn right onto S CR 475 E/Whitney Rd. Turn left onto E CR 125 S/Smithfield Pike. Turn right onto S 625 E. Turn right onto E CR 167 S. Continue on CR 172 S. CR 172 S becomes CR 575 N. The Oakwood Retreat Center will be on the right. You will pass White River Woods which is also on the right.

#### Hotel > McVey Memorial Forest

Turn right onto W Fox Ridge Ln. Turn left onto N Everett Rd. Turn right onto W Purdue Ave (the first cross street). Turn left onto N Everett Rd. Turn right onto 300 N/W Riggin Rd. At the traffic circle, continue onto 300 N/Riggin Rd. Turn left onto N Broadway Ave. Continue straight onto IN-67 N. Keep right to continue on IN-28 E/W State St. Turn right onto IN-1 S. McVey Memorial Forest will be on your left just after the blue bridge that crosses the Mississinewa River.

#### White River Woods > McVey Memorial Forest

Head North on S CR 575 N. S CR 575 E turns right and becomes E CR 172 S. Continue onto E CR 167 S. Turn left onto S CR 700 E. Turn right onto IN-32 E. Turn left onto N 900 W. Continue on IN-1. McVey Memorial Forest will be on your right.

## Parking on Site



McVey Memorial Forest has three parking lots on site. All allow for easy access to the 249-acre site. The parking lots at CRs 750 and 700 only allow for a handful of cars. Overflow vehicles can be parked in the grass near the parking lot at Hgwy 1. The pavilion is where snacks and water will be located Saturday and Sunday. The Mississinewa River can be accessed quite easily from the parking lot at CR 750 N.

A parking lot for the north section of the woods is located west of CR 575 N. The remainder of the property can be accessed by the lane of the retreat center. The lane can be followed west all the way to the White River. Snacks and water can be accessed at the bar Saturday and Sunday.

# Notes about Oakwood Retreat Center and White River Woods

Oakwood Retreat Center barn will be the primary meeting location for this event. Red-tail's White River Woods is adjacent to the retreat center to the north and west.

At Oakwood Retreat Center, enter the campus from the east by turning off CR 575 N. The barn where we will meet is located at the back of the campus, north of the lane.

When driving through the Oakwood campus, please be aware that other retreats will be happening in their main building so please use caution and drive slowly.
